Orientation topics for all caregivers, teachers, and directors working in programs receiving Care 4 Kids

- 1. Prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunization)
- 2. SIDS and use of safe sleep practices
- 3. Administration of medication
- 4. Prevention/response to food allergies
- 5. Building and physical premises safety
- 6. Prevention of shaken baby syndrome and abusive head trauma
- 7. Emergency preparedness and response planning
- 8. Storage of hazardous materials and bio-contaminants
- 9. Precautions in transporting children (if applicable)
- 10. First-aid and CPR
- 11. Recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect
- 12. Child development
- 13. Nutrition
