- A framework that allows a network of centers and/or homes to share staff and costs, usually through a “Hub” or central office
- A way to strengthen an organization’s capacity, by pooling needs and sharing resources, and reinvesting the time and dollar savings into improving program quality

We will have an in-depth discussion of how Shared Services works, some real-life examples of Shared Service Alliances, and a chance for all to explore how it could apply to you.
